How have ideas about childrearing changed since the mid-twentieth century? While kids always need sleep, food and exercise, our concepts of the best ways to raise children have shifted over the last 75 years. In this talk, historian Carla Pascoe Leahy discusses her research into the history of motherhood and childhood in Australia. Drawing upon her interviews with more than sixty Australian mothers, she will explain how some things have changed – and some things have stayed the same.

Dr Carla Pascoe Leahy is an historian at the University of Tasmania where she teaches in the Diploma of Family History. She is also an Honorary Associate at Museums Victoria and Joint Editor of Studies in Oral History, the journal of Oral History Australia.
